



BCC POLICE RANGERS APPLICATION INFORMATION 2017

*Enrolment in BCC Police Rangers is now open.
The ENROLMENT FORM must be completed by **all new and returning rangers.***

***Place the completed form in the Rangers box in either administration office or bring the form to your first parade – Monday 20th February in the College Gymnasium and then in GLA1 on Senior Campus.
Students without an enrolment form will not be admitted.***

Enrolment in the unit signifies a voluntary agreement to accept the code of conduct of WA Police Rangers.

- Parades take place from **15:15– 17:15 every Monday**. Some activities or excursions may require more time. A plan of activities is issued near the start of each term. **Parents should pick students up from the Senior Campus car park at 17:15 sharp.**
- The unit only accepts applications from **Years 8 to 12 at BCC**. Students from outside the college are normally not accepted. The maximum number of Rangers will normally be 50 and preference will be given to continuing rangers and siblings. Any other enrolments will be in preference from Year 12 downwards.
- Once uniforms are issued, **all Rangers are expected to be in uniform** – withdrawal from parade may be enforced if Rangers are regularly out of uniform. The unit provides most uniform items but **Rangers must supply:**
 - **Navy shorts or track pants and sports shoes/ sneakers** for training uniform
 - **A black belt with silver buckle and black boots** for ceremonial uniform
- Rangers who do not attend without explanation for more than **three parades** in a term will be excluded from further participation in the unit. **Please inform the unit in writing if you are withdrawing and return all uniforms.**
- Rangers are expected to complete all curriculum tasks to the best of their ability. **Behaviour should be of a high standard.** Rangers who do not follow the code of conduct may face disciplinary action.
- Preference for camps, excursions and promotion will be given to Rangers who regularly attend parades, wear uniform and actively participate. Promotion is also based upon completion of assessment tasks, participation in volunteer activities and assistance given in the day to day running of the unit. Not all Rangers will be promoted each year.
- The Department for Local Government and Communities provides funding for uniforms and most activities but Rangers are sometimes asked to make a co-payment for camps or high cost activities.
- Camps and excursions require the completion of a medical and permission form to comply with Department of Education policies. These must be handed in by the due date. Late forms will result in the individual being excluded from the camp or activity.
